Personnel

We have had two referrals to Occupational Health in 2021-22, mainly around returning to work/suitability to role.

All staff currently, are fulfilling their contracted roles, with no current workforce adjustments.

COVID 19 incidences

February 2022- Attendance remains lower than 'usual', but in terms of comparison, the school's average attendance this year is higher than national and local statistics. School- 94.6% (NAT 91%; LA 93.9%) SEND 94.6% (NAT 87%) PP 93.4% (NAT 86%).

We have had 6 staff COVID absence (either tested positive or had absence while waiting for a PCR test); 19 children (11 recently in the w/b 31.01.22)

Risk assessments- EEC Live

There are no outstanding Risk Assessments due; there are no further Risk Assessments scheduled until June 2022.

Accident reporting

Since the start of the Lockdown, we have had:

Equipment-related bumps: 13 logged (6 in FS, 4 in KS1, 3 KS2)

FS- 2 on the Bridge area; 4 on the slide in. No injuries have resulted in a pupil having time off from school.

KS1- 2 on the Bridge area; 2 on the slide in. No injuries have resulted in a pupil having time off from school.

KS2- 1 on the Climbing area; 2 on the bars. 1 injury has resulted in a pupil having time off from school- 1 EV1 form sent to HSE.

These figures are higher than last year, although we have to acknowledge that in 2019-20 and 2020-21 there was restricted use of these apparatus due to COVID. Compared to Spring term 1 2020 (eg last pre-COVID H+S report) these figures are marginally lower in comparison.

Outdoor bumps, not linked to equipment: 78 logged (34 in FS, 28 in KS1, 16 in KS2). The vast majority occurred in transition and were almost entirely 'accidental'. Two children were reported injured through other pupils' actions (hit by another child). No EV1 form completed. Again, these are lower than the Spring term 1, 2020.

Indoor bumps: 12 logged (7 in FS, 2 in KS1, 3 in KS2). This is slightly lower than last meeting we reported our H+S log, and also when compared to Spring term 1, 2020.

EV1 reporting

This is when the school report to the Health and Safety Executive where medical attention was required beyond school's first aid. These include:

- One child (Year 3) injured themselves running (no contact with others or trip hazard identified) and an EV1 form was completed.
- One child (Year 4) while playing football on the field, had an accidental injury which also resulted in an EV1 Form being completed.
- One child (Year 3) spun on the bar of the playground apparatus. She rotated awkwardly and made contact with her lower arm, resulting in the injury. EV1 form completed.
- One child (Year 5) turned while running on the playground, and tripped on her own feet landing awkwardly on her arms/hands. EV1 form completed.

All four accidents resulted in children having treatment for fractures (leg/arms). None were reportable to Riddor (eg because of equipment failure). All injuries were accidental and did not involve other pupils/staff or equipment malfunction.

We have had slightly more pupils needing external medical assessments than in previous terms, although as stated there is no pattern of occurrence or link. Monitor this coming term to see if there is a reduction in incidents- feedback March 2022.

Staff injuries:

One member of cleaning staff (contracted) had an injury when depositing bins due to poor light visibility later in the evening. No treatment required but logged.
